A Bill to Invade South Korea

Line 01 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

Line 03 SECTION 1. This Bill acts to invade South Korea to open new economic

BILL: Requirement for Photographic Evidence in Speed Camera Violations

Be it enacted,

BILL: Requirement for Photographic Evidence in Speed Camera Violations

Section 1:

This Bill aims to enhance the accuracy and fairness of speed camera violations by mandating the inclusion of photographic evidence of the driver alongside the license plate in all related citations Section 2:

All speed cameras utilized for traffic enforcement must be equipped with technology capable of capturing clear images of both the vehicle's license plate and the driver's face at the time of the violation. Citations issued for speed camera violations shall include this photographic evidence to ensure proper identification and accountability of the driver.

Section 3:

- (a) This bill seeks to protect the rights of drivers by ensuring that violations are substantiated with identifiable evidence, reducing the potential for wrongful citations.
- (b) A Compliance Assessment Board, consisting of experts in traffic law and civil rights, will monitor the implementation of this requirement and assess its impact on traffic enforcement. The Board will submit findings to Congress annually.

Section 4:

This bill will take effect on January 1, 2026, directing relevant transportation and law enforcement agencies to update their speed camera systems and practices following this legislation.

Docket B: Virginia Bill 8118

A Bill to Allow the Unrestricted Installment of Speed Cameras

Be it enacted,

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. Current restrictions against the installment of speed cameras shall be lifted.

SECTION 2. Excluding private roads and federal land, counties and independent cities in the

Commonwealth of Virginia shall be allowed to install speed cameras on any road under their jurisdiction.

SECTION 3. Implementation of this bill shall be carried out by each individual county or independent city if installed by their local government. Local law enforcement will monitor and track for any speeding violations caught and will manage speeding tickets accordingly.

SECTION 4. This legislation shall be effective immediately. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

Docket B: Economic Bill 8113

`A Bill to Reform Natural Disaster Relief

Be it enacted,

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) shall be dissolved, and the federal government shall directly administer funds to states and localities affected by natural disasters.

SECTION 2. "Natural Disaster" shall be defined as any natural or man-made disaster causing widespread destruction and requiring federal intervention

B. "Direct Administration" shall refer to the process of federal funds being allocated to affected states and localities without the role of FEMA

SECTION 3.

The Department of the Treasury shall oversee the allocation and distribution of disaster relief funds. The Department of Homeland Security shall coordinate disaster response efforts in collaboration with state and local governments.

SECTION 4. This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2026 All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

Super Session: Economic Bill 8117

A Bill to Eliminate the Debt Ceiling and Reduce National Debt

Be it enacted,

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. The debt ceiling set by congress shall be eliminated, and the federal government shall reduce national debt by downsizing the federal workforce and eliminating obsolete government agencies.

SECTION 2. A. "Debt Ceiling" shall be defined as the legal limit on the total amount of federal debt the government can accumulate.

B. "Obsolete Government Agencies" shall be defined as government agencies that no longer have a purpose, or have duplicative responsibilities

SECTION 3.

The Office of Management and Budget shall conduct a review of all federal agencies and submit a list of agencies deemed obsolete to congress within 1 year of this bill's enactment.

The Department of Labor shall oversee workforce reductions to make sure all government workers affected can easily find jobs after being laid off.

SECTION 4. This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2026. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
