Be it enacted,

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

Line 01: SECTION 1. Financial assistance of 30 billion dollars will be sent to California to

Line 02: assist the families, businesses, and individuals affected by the 2025 California

Line 03: wildfires. The funds will also be distributed to provide the necessary equipment and

Line 04: technology for affected fire stations, environmental restoration, and mental health

Line 05: services.

Line 06: SECTION 2. The 2025 California wildfires refers to not only the Eaton Fire in

Line 07: Altadena and the Palisades Fire in Pacific Palisades but to all 14 wildfires that

Line 08: caused damage in Los Angeles and San Diego.

Line 09: SECTION 3. The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) will oversee

Line 10: the implementation of this bill.

Line 11: SECTION 4. This bill shall take effect immediately upon passage.

A Bill to Ban Assisted Euthanasia in States that Currently Allow it

Be it enacted,

- 1 SECTION 1. Assisted euthanasia is hereby prohibited in all states that currently permit
2 the practice. Medical professionals, institutions, and individuals are
3 prohibited from participating in any form of assisted euthanasia, including
4 providing the means or methods to carry out such procedures.
- 5 SECTION 2. “Assisted Euthanasia” is the act of intentionally assisting a person in
6 ending their own life, whether through providing lethal substances,
7 medical devices, or other means.
- 8 SECTION 3. The Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) will oversee the
9 enforcement of this bill, in cooperation with state health departments.
- 10 A. HHS will ensure that states comply with this legislation by conducting
11 regular audits, and issuing penalties for non-compliance, including
12 reductions in federal healthcare funding.
- 13 SECTION 4. This legislation will take effect on July 1, 2025. All laws in conflict with this
14 legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Terminate All Use of Cryptocurrency.

Be it enacted,

SECTION 1. This bill shall hereby terminate all use of cryptocurrency. This legislation shall also prohibit any process in the creation of cryptocurrency in any U.S. state or territory.

SECTION 2. Cryptocurrency refers to a digital currency in which transactions are recorded by a decentralized system using cryptography. Terminate means to end and make any use or creation of cryptocurrency within the jurisdiction of the United States. This would also include any transactions, mining, exchanges, and any other activities relating to cryptocurrency.

SECTION 3. The United States Department of the Treasury, especially the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) shall oversee the implementation and enforcement of this bill.

SECTION 4. This bill will take effect immediately on April 12th, 2025.

A Bill To Prohibit Restorative Justice Practices in Virginia

Be it enacted,

SECTION 1. This Act shall be called the “Elimination of Restorative Justice in Virginia Act.” Its goal is to keep Virginia’s justice system focused on real consequences for crime instead of ineffective programs that let offenders off easy.

SECTION 2. No schools, courts, or prisons in Virginia can use or fund restorative justice programs. The justice system should focus on punishment and deterrence through jail time, probation, and mandatory rehabilitation when needed. Any money currently spent on these programs should go toward law enforcement, prisons, and services that actually help victims.

SECTION 3. The Virginia Department of Criminal Justice Services will make sure this law is followed. Any institution that violates it will lose funding and face legal action.

SECTION 4. This legislation will take effect on April 12, 2025

SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby considered null and void.

Docket A: International Bill 2576

A Bill to Empower Greenland Into Independence and Further American Resource Extraction Interests

Be it enacted,

Line 01: SECTION 1. The United States Department of the Treasury and the United States
Line 02: Department of State will provide Greenland with the benefits defined in Section 3 if
Line 03: it meets the criteria defined in Section 2. If Greenland meets this criteria but
Line 04: then is found by Congress to have ceased to do so, the United States will no longer
Line 05: be obligated to continue providing the benefits defined in Section 3. Benefits that
Line 06: have already been provided to Greenland, however, will not be retroactively
Line 07: rescinded.

Line 06: SECTION 2. Greenland must adhere to the following criteria if it is to receive the
Line 07: benefits defined in Section 3:

Line 08: 1) Greenland must declare independence from Denmark through either a
Line 09: referendum voted on by the Greenland electorate or through an Act enacted by the
Line 10: Government of Greenland.

Line 11: 2) The Government of Greenland must prohibit all tariffs on goods imported from or
Line 12: exported to the United States and its territories.

Line 13: 3) The Government of Greenland must place a tariff of 5% on all goods that are
Line 14: exported to China, with an additional 5% on fossil fuels and an additional 10% on
Line 15: mineral resources.

Line 16: 4) The Government of Greenland must appropriately sell the permits and resource
Line 17: extraction licenses to US-based resource extraction companies when requested.
Line 18: Additionally, US-based resource extraction companies must be granted priority in
Line 19: acquiring the ownership of resource deposits in Greenland over all other companies,
Line 20: except those based in Greenland, which they must share an equal priority with.

Line 21: 5) The operations of US-based resource extraction companies must be given
Line 22: priority over Greenlandic interests when using infrastructure created in Greenland
Line 23: by US-based companies.

Line 24: SECTION 3. Greenland will receive the following benefits from the United States in
Line 25: return for adhering to the criteria defined in Section 2:

Line 26: 1) The United States will recognise Greenland as an independent and sovereign
Line 27: nation.

Line 28: 2) The United States will ally with the independent country of Greenland and provide
Line 29: the same military defense that it provides to NATO allies.

Line 30: 4) The United States will prohibit all tariffs on goods imported from or exported to
Line 31: Greenland.

Line 32: 5) The United States Department of the Treasury will provide the Government of
Line 33: Greenland with a block grant on January 1 of each calendar year consisting of \$1
Line 34: billion USD. This value will be adjusted for inflation rates in the United States on

Line 35: January 1 of even-numbered years according to increases in the CPI-U (Consumer

Line 36: Price Index for all Urban Consumers) as published by the US Bureau of Labor

Line 37: Statistics.

Line 38: 6) US-based resource extraction companies operating in Greenland will provide 30%

Line 39: of all extracted resources to the Government of Greenland.

Line 40: 7) Infrastructure created in Greenland by US-based companies as a result of

Line 41: resource extraction, such as ports, roads, and bridges, will be granted to the

Line 42: Greenland government immediately upon creation.

Line 43: SECTION 4. For the purposes of this legislation, the following definitions are valid:

Line 44: 1) "Resource" refers to fossil fuels like oil and gas, minerals like rare-earth elements,

Line 45: and materials like sand and gravel.

Line 46: 2) "US-based" refers to companies that were incorporated in the United States.

Line 47: 3) "Resource extraction" refers to the process of removing resources from the

Line 48: ground through techniques such as mining and drilling.

Line 49: SECTION 5. The Department of the Treasury and the Department of State shall

Line 50: oversee the provisions of this bill. Additionally, the United States Department of

Line 51: Energy, Federal Trade Commission, and Department of Justice will cooperate with the

Line 52: Government of Greenland to ensure that US-based resource extraction operations in

Line 53: Greenland adhere to Greenlandic and US law, to check whether the criteria defined

Line 54: in Section 2 of this legislation are being fulfilled, and to confirm that the benefits

Line 55: defined in Section 3 are being granted.

Line 56: SECTION 6. This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2026. All laws that are in

Line 57: conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
