The Assisted Euthanasia Resource Limitation (AERL) Act

Be it enacted,

- 1 SECTION 1. Given that the decision of assisted euthanasia
- 2 is not a power delegated to the Federal Government of the
- 3 United States by the US Constitution, in accordance with
- 4 Amendment X of the US Constitution, this decision resides
- 5 with each individual state or, if not prohibited by that state,
- 6 with each individual person. Therefore, the Federal Government
- 7 will not provide any resources or funding for
- 8 drug induced or any other type of assisted euthanasia.

- 10 SECTION 2. For the purposes of this bill, Assisted Euthanasia
- 11 shall refer to the act of deliberately ending a person's life to
- 12 Relieve suffering. Assisted Euthanasia is typically performed
- 13 by a physician administering a lethal drug to a patient.
- 14 Further, Amendment X states
- 15 "The powers not delegated to the United States by the
- 16 Constitution, nor prohibited by it to the states, are reserved to
- 17 the states respectively, or to the people."

- 19 SECTION 3. The Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA)
- 20 shall oversee the enforcement of this bill along with the
- 21 Department of Human Health and Services (HHS).
- 22 The DEA regulates drug administration and provision
- 23 and would therefore oversee the implementation of this bill.
- 24 The HHS oversees healthcare policy and administration in
- 25 the U.S. and would therefore oversee the implementation of this bill.

27 SECTION 4. This bill will take effect on May 1, 2025.

Be it enacted,

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. In an effort to reduce crime rates, more funding for new systems of criminal reform, including but not limited to restorative justice will be implemented throughout the country. The government will provide preliminary funding and the rest will be done by the state prisons and judiciary systems.

SECTION 2. "New criminal reform systems" refers to the use of more unorthodox styles of criminal reform unlike the traditional sentences of prison, community service, and fines. An example of this is restorative justice as mentioned before. In this way, criminals will compensate for their crime by attempting to fix their mistake and also receive counseling. Preliminary funding is just a small amount of money put forth to start up a program. To implement in this case means to expand access, not mandate.

SECTION 3. The DOJ (Department of Justice) will oversee the implementation and do scheduled check-ins as well. The funding will be provided at congress' discretion.

SECTION 4. This legislation will take effect on August 3rd, 2025.

The Greenland Trade Act

Be it enacted,

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

3 SECTION 1. The United States shall attempt open trade relations with Greenland, in 4 which the United States will provide Greenland with adequate payment for its natural 5 resources. More specific terms shall be determined separately, in consort with the states 6 of Greenland and Denmark.

7

8 SECTION 2. For the purposes of this bill, natural resources shall refer to the mineable 9 resources present in Greenland. This includes but is not limited to rare earth elements 10 such as neodymium, dysprosium, praseodymium, and terbium; precious metals such as 11 gold and platinum; and oil and natural gas deposits.

12

- 13 SECTION 3. The Office of the United States Trade Representative (USTR) and the 14 Department of Commerce (DOC) shall oversee the enforcement of this bill, as these
- 15 departments are the most focused on ensuring fair trade terms and relations. The
- 16 Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) will help to monitor the sustainable extraction of
- 17 natural resources from Greenland, along with the Greenland's Environmental Agency for
- 18 Mineral Resource Activities (EAMRA).

20 SECTION 4. This bill will take effect on May 1st, 2025.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1 SECTION 1. -Given that an estimate given in 2009 by the SWC (Simon Wiesenthal
- 2 Center) stated that around 10,000 websites dedicated to hate and terrorist sentiment exist 3 on the internet
- 4 Given that modern terrorist organizations no longer meet in person and now the terrorists
- 5 have a mask of anonymity to hide from the law given from online forums
- 6 Be it enacted that visitors and users of the following websites, whether being brief visits or
- 7 account creation, will be placed on a possible terrorist watchlist and their posts monitored 8 more closely by the Federal Bureau of Investigation:
- 9 4chan.com
- 10 tellagram.com
- 11 torproject.com
- 12 other websites in association with known or confirmed hate and terrorist organizations
- 13 as listed by the (SPLC) Southern Poverty Law Center, i.e. The KKK, the American Nazi
- 14 Party, , The ACTBAC NC a notorious neo-confederate movement
- 15 SECTION 2. The FBI will investigate websites found based off of our current
- 16 definitions of a terrorist organization or hate group.
- 17 A terrorist group is defined by 18 U.S. Code § 2331 as:
- 18 (A)involve acts dangerous to human life that are a violation of the criminal laws of the
- 19 United States or of any State;
- 20 (B)appear to be intended—
- 21 (i)to intimidate or coerce a civilian population;
- 22 (ii)to influence the policy of a government by intimidation or coercion; or
- 23 (iii) to affect the conduct of a government by mass destruction, assassination, or
- 24 kidnapping; and
- 25 (C)occur primarily within the territorial jurisdiction of the United States
- 26 A "hate group" or "hate organization" is defined as:
- 27 A social that advocates and/or practices hatred, hostility, or violence towards of a race,
- 28 gender, sexuality, or ethnicity
- 29 outside of their own
- 30
- 31 SECTION 2. Individuals placed on this watchlist with sufficient evidence will be
- 32 restricted in certain
- 33 items that will from now on be designated as "Yellow Items" and "Red Items" and will
- 34 face fine for being found in possession of said"Yellow Items" and can face jail time of up
- 35 to 10 years with another 3 year probation
- 36 Yellow Items include but are not limited to:
- 37 Terrorist manifestos, i.e. Mein Kampf, The Unabomber Manifesto, The Anarchist
- 38 Cookbook

- 39 Items that in bulk could create dangerous or blacklisted substances, i.e. ammonia,
- 40 fertilizer, bulk metals
- 41 Red items include but are not limited to:
- 42 Fire arms

- 44 SECTION 3. This responsibility would fall under the watch of the FBI, with raids and
- 45 searches of possible terrorists being overseen by both the ATF and the Department of
- 46 Homeland Security at the discretion of the FBI.
- 47 This bill would now enshrine the FBI as a permanent government agency so that the
- 48 United States Government can do its job and keep the American people safe.
- 49 Property of suspected terrorists will have their home, car, and other storage property will
- 50 be searched for any convict-able evidence, if none is to be found then they will be placed
- 51 on the watchlist, if there is proof of affiliation with terrorist organizations then they will
- 52 be arrested on said charges.
