## **Docket A: Domestic Bill 3333**

### *Domestic Terrorism Prevention Act of 2025*

Be it enacted,

1. SECTION 1. Purpose and Findings.

2.

3. Domestic terrorism—violent or coercive acts aimed at intimidating civilians or influencing

4. government policy—poses serious threats to public safety, national security, and

5. constitutional freedoms. This Act seeks to criminalize such acts, enhance law

6. enforcement and intelligence coordination, and safeguard civil liberties.

7.

8. SECTION 2. Prohibited Conduct and Penalties.

9. It is unlawful to plan, finance, execute, or provide support for acts of domestic terrorism.

10. Violators shall face fines and imprisonment, with enhanced penalties if the act results in

11. death, serious bodily injury, or targets critical infrastructure.

12.

13. SECTION 3. Coordination and Enforcement.

14. The Attorney General shall establish a Domestic Terrorism Coordination Center (DTCC)

15. to facilitate real-time intelligence sharing and coordinate responses among federal,

16. state, and local law enforcement agencies.

17.

18. SECTION 5. Civil Liberties and Oversight.

19. All actions under this Act must respect constitutional rights, including free speech and

20. assembly. An independent review board shall be created to monitor implementation and

21. report annually to Congress.

22.

23. SECTION 6. Funding, Reporting, and Sunset.

24. Appropriations shall support DTCC operations and state/local counterterrorism

25. initiatives. An annual report detailing incidents, prosecutions, and interagency

26. coordination shall be submitted to Congress. This Act shall be reviewed after 10 years,

27. and if any provision is found invalid, the remainder shall remain in effect.

28. SECTION 7. Effective Date.

29. This Act shall take effect 180 days after enactment.

## **Docket A: Domestic Bill 0111**

### *A Bill to Legalize Assisted Euthanasia under Restrictions*

Be it enacted,

SECTION 1. This Bill would allow doctors and medical specialists to perform Assisted Euthanasia on patients who fall under specific criteria. The patient criteria are: being over the age of eighteen; being a U.S. citizen; suffering from a terminal illness that will end their life span within six months; and being in a physical state that could not be recovered from. Lastly, the patient will have to pass an assessment performed by a licensed mental health care professional, that proves the patient is competent to make this decision and is informed on the topic.

SECTION 2. 1. Assisted Euthanasia is defined as assisted suicide by which a person with the help of a professional, takes drugs that will end their life.

2. Terminal illness is defined as any health condition ending in death within six months.

SECTION 3. The Health and Human Services will oversee the enforcement of the bill.

SECTION 4. This bill will take effect on July 1, 2025.

SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

## **Docket A: Virginia Bill 0112**

### *A Bill to Abolish Select Mandatory Minimum Sentencing Requirements*

Be it enacted,

SECTION 1. The Commonwealth of Virginia shall abolish mandatory minimum sentencing for crimes including drug possession without violent crimes associated, vandalism, and drunk driving without personal injury. The Commonwealth of Virginia shall allow judges the discretion to decide whether maintained mandatory minimum sentences are to be served concurrently or consecutively.

SECTION 2. Mandatory minimum sentencing is defined as legal provisions that require a specific minimum prison term for certain crimes, regardless of individual circumstances.

Concurrent sentencing is defined as serving all the sentences at the same time, so the longest sentence determines the total sentence length.

Consecutive sentencing is defined as serving individual sentences one at a time, so that the sum of the sentences determines the total sentence length.

SECTION 3. The Virginia Office of Criminal Justice Services will oversee the implementation of this legislation.

SECTION 4. This legislation will take effect on July 1, 2025. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

### ***A BILL TO PRESERVE FEDERAL NATURAL DISASTER RELIEF BENEFIT***

Be it enacted,

Line 01: SECTION 1. The purpose of this bill is to ensure the continuation and funding of  
Line 02: federal natural disaster relief programs, which includes, but not limited to, the Federal  
Line 03: Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), the Disaster Relief Fund (DRF), and other  
Line 04: federal assistance programs designed to provide aid to communities affected by natural

### ***A BILL TO LEGALIZE ASSISTED EUTHANASIA FOR TERMINALLY ILL PATIENTS***

Be it enacted,

Line 01: SECTION 1.

Line 02: Assisted euthanasia shall be legalized for terminally ill patients who voluntarily

Line 03: request it,

Line 04: provided they meet the eligibility criteria outlined in this legislation.

Line 05: SECTION 2.

Line 06: a. "Assisted euthanasia" shall be defined as the administration of life-ending

Line 07: medication by a licensed physician or the provision of such medication to a patient

Line 08: for self-administration.

Line 09: b. "Terminally ill" shall be defined as having an incurable and irreversible condition

Line 10: that is expected to result in death within six months, as confirmed by two

Line 11: independent physicians.

Line 12: c. "Voluntary request" shall mean a written and witnessed declaration by the patient,

Line 13: made without coercion and reaffirmed after a waiting period of at least 15 days.

Line 14: SECTION 3.

Line 15: The Department of Health and Human Services shall oversee the implementation of

Line 16: this bill.

Line 17: Physicians must document all requests and confirm eligibility before proceeding.

Line 18: A state review board shall be established to investigate any complaints or

Line 19: allegations of abuse.

Line 20: Violations of this legislation shall result in penalties, including suspension or

Line 21: revocation of

Line 22: medical licenses and criminal liability as deemed appropriate by law.

Line 24: The provisions of this bill shall take effect 180 days after its passage.

### *A Bill to Reform the Use of Speed Cameras in Virginia to Enhance Safety and Transparency on the Road*

Be it resolved,

Line 01: Whereas, Speed cameras have been implemented in certain Virginia jurisdictions to improve  
Line 02: traffic safety and reduce speeding-related accidents;

Line 03: Whereas, concerns have been raised about the effectiveness, fairness, and transparency of  
Line 04: the current speed camera programs;

Line 05: Whereas, the collection of fines through speed camera enforcement may disproportionately  
Line 06: affect lower-income communities and individuals who may be unfairly  
Line 07: penalized;

Line 08: Whereas, the state recognizes the importance of balancing traffic safety with due process  
Line 09: and equitable treatment of all residents;

Line 10: Now, therefore, It may be enacted that the following reforms be implemented to improve  
Line 11: the use and oversight of speed camera programs in Virginia.

Line 12: Resolved, An committee will be formed to review existing speed camera programs. This  
Line 13: committee will review whether speed cameras are being used effectively to  
Line 14: reduce traffic accidents or if they are primarily being used as  
Line 15: revenue-generating tools.

Line 16: Resolved, The committee will consist of state lawmakers, law enforcement representatives,  
Line 17: legal experts, and community stakeholders.

Line 18: Resolved, Require that the locations of all active speed cameras be made publicly available,  
Line 19: both online and through local government communication channels, so that  
Line 20: drivers can be informed. Approximately a quarter mile from the speed  
Line 21: camera. This will promote safer driving in high traffic areas and minimize the  
Line 22: number of fines given to citizens.

Line 23: Resolved, Require that the evidence collected (e.g., photos, videos, data) be available for  
Line 24: public review in the case of disputes.

Line 25: Further resolved, The Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) will be fully responsible  
Line 26: for overseeing this process ensuring they are placed in high-risk areas and  
Line 27: managing the technology to ensure accuracy and reliability.

Line 28: Further resolved, This bill shall take effect on January 1st, 2026, all legislation in conflict will  
Line 29: hereby be declared null and void.

Line 18: Chinese access to advanced chip-making technologies and  
Line 19: safeguard global supply chains, and be it further

### *A Bill to Strengthen U.S. - South Korean Relations Through Economic and Security Cooperation*

Be it enacted,

Line 01: WHEREAS, The United States and the Republic of Korea ( South Korea) have maintained a  
Line 02: strong alliance for over seven decades. Contributing to regional stability, economic  
Line 03: growth, and security in East Asia;

Line 04: WHEREAS, The ongoing security threats in the Indo-Pacific region, including North Korea's  
Line 05: nuclear ambition and geopolitical tensions, require continued strategic cooperation  
Line 06: between the aforementioned U.S. and South Korea;

Line 07: WHEREAS, the Economic ties between the U.S and South Korea, including trade agreements  
Line 08: such as the Korean-U.S Free Trade Agreement (KORUS FTA), have contributed to mutual  
Line 09: prosperity but require modernization to address emerging economic challenge;

Line: 13: WHEREAS, Strengthening societal exchange through specific personable involvement,  
Line 14: educational partnerships, and cultural diplomacy will enhance mutual understanding and  
Line 15: long-term cooperation;

Line 16: NOW THEREFORE, it may be enacted that the following measures be implemented to  
Line 17: reinforce U.S and South Korea's relations through diplomatic, economic, and security  
Line 18: initiatives.

Line 19: RESOLVED, The United States and South Korea shall establish an annual U.S.-Republic of  
Line 20: South Korea (ROK) Strategic Dialogue, involving government officials, business leaders,  
Line 21: and security experts to address bilateral concerns, including defense and technological  
Line 22: collaboration.

Line 23: RESOLVED, The United States shall work with South Korea to enhance joint military  
Line 24: readiness by expanding joint exercises, investing in missile defense systems, improving  
Line 25: intelligence and sharing of the aforementioned improvements capabilities to strengthen  
Line 26: the close ties between the two nations.

Line 27: FURTHER RESOLVED, The U.S. State Department and the South Korean Ministry of Foreign  
Line 28: Affairs shall oversee the implementation of these measures, ensuring continued progress  
Line 29: in diplomatic and economic relations

Line 30: FURTHER RESOLVED: The bill shall take effect on January 1st, 2026, and all conflicting  
Line 31: legislation will hereby be declared null and void.
