A bill to Establish Corporate Accountability for Pharmaceutical Companies in the Opioid Epidemic

Be it enacted,

1 SECTION ONE. Pharmaceutical companies must be held accountable for their role
2 in the ongoing opioid crisis. Pharmaceutical companies, pharmaceutical executives,
3 drug distributors, and health care providers shall be held accountable for crimes such as 4fraud in
deceptive marketing, reckless endangerment, and neglectance through fines not 5exceeding \$10 million
dollars and/or up to 30 years in federal prison The money from 6fines shall go to increasing
7 opioid addiction treatments, rehab centers, and public health educational programs

8

9 SECTION TWO. Pharmaceutical is defined as relating to medicinal drugs, or their
10 preparation, use, or sale. Opioid is defined as a compound resembling opium and
11 addictive properties or physiological effects. Pharmaceutical companies are defined as
12 a business licensed to research, development, market, and distribute drugs, primarily for
13 healthcare purposes. Pharmaceutical executives are defined as leaders in the
14pharmaceutical sector, responsible for making strategic decisions for that impact drug
15development. Drug distributors are defined as pharmaceutical wholesalers, are
16businesses that purchase the drug. Health care providers are defined as individuals or
17organizations who provide medical and health services to patients.

19 SECTION THREE. The Department of Justice will oversee
20 the investigations and enforcement of penalties. The Center for Disease Control and
21 Prevention will track data and increase the amount of opioid addiction treatment,
22rehab centers, and public health educational campaigns. The Federal Trade
23commission will oversee the business practices of pharmaceutical companies.

25 SECTION FOUR. This legislation will take effect on September 1st, 2025. All laws in

Be it enacted,

Line 01: BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

Line 02: SECTION 1. To ensure sustainable growth, and environmental stewardship,

Line 03: all newly established data centers within the United States must be

Line 04: constructed near unexhausted, low-risk water sources or utilize
