A RESOLUTION TO DEFEND SANCTUARY CITY POLICIES AND PROTECT COMMUNITY SAFETY AND CIVIL LIBERTIES

Be it resolved,

Line 01: Whereas, sanctuary cities are areas that have policies in place to
Line 02: limit cooperation with federal immigration enforcement. The policies
Line 03: do not, however, protect local law enforcement from arresting,
Line 04: charging, or prosecuting individuals for crimes committed under local
Line 05: and state law; and

Line 06: Whereas, sanctuary policies are an expression of local authority and
Line 07: a lawful exercise of that authority based upon the Constitution.
Line 08: Additionally, ICE civil detainer requests are not judicial warrants and
Line 09: multiple courts have ruled that complying with ICE detainers without
Line 10: a warrant may violate the 4th Amendment's prohibition of
Line 11: unreasonable seizures and therefore Local Governments that comply
Line 12: will be at potential legal risk; and

Line 13: Whereas, every person present on United States soil, regardless of
Line 14: immigration status, is afforded constitutional protections including
Line 15: due process rights, and sanctuary policies help ensure that these
Line 16: protections are upheld by local law enforcement agencies; and
Line 17: Whereas, undocumented immigrants contribute substantially to
Line 18: local economies and communities, collectively paying an estimated
Line 19: \$11.74 billion in state and local taxes annually according to the
Line 20: American Immigration Council, therefore be it

Line 21: Resolved, that local and state governments shall retain the right to
Line 22: adopt sanctuary policies that limit cooperation with federal civil
Line 23: immigration enforcement, and that no federal funding to
Line 24: municipalities shall be conditioned upon the abandonment of such
Line 25: constitutional local policing decisions; and, be it further
Line 26: Resolved, the U.S. Department of Justice will provide local law
Line 27: enforcement with clear guidance on the distinction between criminal
Line 28: law enforcement cooperation, in which local law enforcement can
Line 29: continue, and civil immigration enforcement. This will enable
Line 30: immigrant communities to report crimes, cooperate with local law
Line 31: enforcement, and have access to public safety resources without the
Line 32: fear of being deported as monitored by the U.S. Department of

A BILL TO ESTABLISH THE DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE AS AN INDEPENDENT, NON-PARTISAN FEDERAL ENTITY VOID OF POLITICAL INFLUENCE

Be it enacted,

Line 01: Article I (Title):

Line 02: This Act may be referred to as the “Department of Justice Independence and Integrity
Line 03: Act.”

Line 04:

Line 05: Article II (Purpose):

Line 06: The Act’s purpose is to restructure the Department of Justice to ensure its
Line 07: independence from partisan influence, modeled on the Federal Reserve System’s
Line 08: governance structure.

Line 09:

Line 10: Article III (Department of Justice Oversight Board):

Line 11: (a) A Department of Justice Oversight Board is established, consisting of seven
Line 12: members; it will include the Attorney General, who shall serve as Chair.

Line 13: (b) Members of the Board must receive presidential appointment along with Senate
Line 14: consent, requiring an affirmative vote of 60 Senators. More than four serving members
Line 15: may not be affiliated with the same political party.

Line 16: (c) Members of the Board will serve staggered, non-renewable terms of 14 years, in
Line 17: alignment with the Federal Reserve Board of Governors.

Line 18:

Line 19: Article IV (Removal Protections):

Line 20: Any member of the Board, including the Attorney General, may be subject to removal
Line 21: by the President only for cause; cause shall be defined as neglect of duty,
Line 22: malfeasance, incapacity, or felony conviction. The President must provide Congress
Line 23: with notice 30 days before any removal, clearly specifying grounds for removal.

Line 25: Article V (Prohibition on Executive Direction of Investigation):

Line 26: (a) Officers or employees of the Executive Office of the President shall be prohibited
Line 27: from directing, requesting, or suggesting the Department open, close, or terminate any
Line 28: investigation or prosecution. Documented channels shall be used to communicate the
Line 29: status of a specific case.

Line 30: (b) The reception of such prohibited communication must be reported to the Board
Line 31: within 72 hours. Willful violations will be cause for removal from federal office.

A Bill to Incentivize Domestic Production While Regulating Harmful Outsourcing Practices

Be it enacted,

SECTION 1. The United States federal government shall establish tax incentives for companies that maintain or expand domestic employment while implementing transparency requirements and targeted penalties for corporations that outsource jobs primarily to evade labor or environmental regulations.

SECTION 2. A. "Targeted penalties" shall be defined as financial disincentives applied to corporations that reduce U.S. employment by more than 15% within a fiscal year while simultaneously increasing foreign labor operations. B. "Tax incentives" shall be defined as federal corporate tax credits equal to up to 10% of wages paid to newly created domestic jobs in qualifying industries.

SECTION 3. The U.S. Department of Labor (DOL) shall oversee employment reporting compliance.

The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) shall administer tax credits and penalties.

Corporations with more than 500 employees must submit annual public reports detailing domestic employment numbers, foreign employment numbers, and locations of major production facilities.

Companies found deliberately misreporting data shall face fines not exceeding \$5,000,000 per violation.

This program shall be funded through revenue generated from penalties imposed under this Act, as well as reallocation of 0.5% of the existing federal corporate tax revenue toward domestic workforce development incentives.

SECTION 4. This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2027. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Enact a Federal Sales Tax on Luxury Purchases

Be it enacted,

Be it enacted by this Richmond Forum Speech and Debate League Student Congress here assembled that:

- Article I: The federal government shall enact a 7-percent sales tax on high-cost and luxury purchases.
- Article II: A) "High-cost and luxury purchases" shall be defined as purchases of individual goods over \$200,000.
B) The Internal Revenue Service shall have the ability to raise or lower the price limit for specific goods subject to the tax by up to \$75,000.
- Article III: Enforcement of this legislation shall be carried out by the Internal Revenue Service, which will collect the 7-percent sales tax, enforce punishments for not paying the tax, and exercise the ability given to it in Article II Section B of this bill.
- Article IV: This legislation shall take effect on August 1, 2026.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. State and local governments receiving federal funding shall not adopt or enforce sanctuary city policies that restrict cooperation with federal immigration enforcement.

SECTION 2. For the purposes of this legislation, a “sanctuary city” is defined as any state or local jurisdiction that limits communication or cooperation with federal immigration authorities regarding the immigration status of individuals.

SECTION 3. Enforcement of this legislation shall be overseen by the U.S. Department of Justice and the Department of Homeland Security. Jurisdictions found in violation may have certain federal law enforcement grants withheld until compliance is achieved.

A. Federal agencies may review local policies and request documentation to ensure compliance.

SECTION 4. This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2026. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
