1221: A Bill to Provide Humanitarian Aid to Myanmar

BE IT ENACTED BY THIS STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

## **Docket A: Virginia Bill 1222**

### *A Bill to Amend the Residential Landlord-Tenant Act to Include Rent Control*

Be it resolved,

1222 - A Bill to Amend the Residential Landlord-Tenant Act to Include Rent Control

SECTION 1. The Virginia state government shall amend the Residential Landlord-Tenant Act to include rent control for any price increases above inflation.

SECTION 2. "Residential Landlord-Tenant Act" is defined as the mandatory legal framework governing most residential rentals to enforce the rights, obligations, and remedies of both landlords and tenants.

A. "Rent control" shall be defined as the regulations preventing or capping price increases to rent for tenants by landlords on residential rentals during annual rent increases.

B. Inflation is defined as the steady, sustained rise in the cost of goods, services, and operating expenses determined by the Consumer Price Index (CPI).

SECTION 3. The Virginia Department of Housing and Community Development (DHCD) shall enforce and oversee this legislation.

A. The DHCD will be responsible for mandating a cap of 5% in addition to inflation for rent control.

SECTION 4. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

### *A Bill to Prohibit Federal Funding Punishment Against Sanctuary Cities to Protect Local Public Services*

Be it enacted,

1224: A Bill to Prohibit Federal Funding Punishment Against Sanctuary Cities to Protect Local Public Services

SECTION 1. The federal government shall be prohibited from reducing, withholding, conditioning, or terminating federal funding to any city or municipality solely based on its designation or operation as a sanctuary city.

SECTION 2. A. "Sanctuary City" shall be defined as any municipality that limits cooperation with federal immigration enforcement agencies through official policy or law

B. "Federal Funding" shall be defined as grants, financial aid, or assistance provided from the federal government to state or local governments

C. "Funding Retaliation" is defined as punitive financial action taken solely due to a city's status as a sanctuary city

SECTION 3. The U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ) shall oversee enforcement of this legislation

A. The DOJ shall investigate violations and allow for municipalities wrongfully denied funding to file for injunctive relief

SECTION 4. This bill shall be implemented on the first day of Fiscal Year 2027

SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

Line 01: SECTION 1. State and local law enforcement agencies shall enforce federal  
Line 02: immigration law and cooperate fully with federal immigration authorities in the  
Line 03: identification, detention, and transfer of individuals subject to immigration  
Line 04: violations.

### *The National Consumption Tax Reform Act*

Be it enacted,

Line 01: SECTION 1. The United States federal government shall impose a 25 percent  
Line 02: federal sales tax on all final retail purchases of goods and services. This tax shall  
Line 03: replace the federal individual and corporate income taxes. Federal payroll taxes  
Line 04: funding Social Security and Medicare shall remain in effect.

Line 05:

Line 06: SECTION 2. "Federal sales tax" is defined as a national consumption tax  
Line 07: collected at the point of final retail sale of goods and services. "Final retail sale" is  
Line 08: defined as the sale of goods or services to an end consumer for personal use and  
Line 09: not for resale or business-to-business transactions. "Retailer" is defined as any  
Line 10: individual or business entity that sells taxable goods or services directly to  
Line 11: consumers, including online vendors.

Line 13: SECTION 3. The Internal Revenue Service (IRS), under the authority of the  
Line 14: Department of the Treasury, shall oversee the collection, enforcement, and auditing  
Line 15: of the federal sales tax.

Line 16: A. Retailers shall collect the 25 percent federal sales tax at the point of sale and  
Line 17: remit collected taxes to the IRS on a monthly basis.

Line 18: B. Retailers who fail to collect or remit the required federal sales tax shall be  
Line 19: subject to a civil penalty equal to twice the amount owed, in addition to applicable  
Line 20: interest and further penalties for willful tax evasion.

### *A Bill to A Bill to Extend Hunting Seasons to Address Wildlife Overpopulation*

Be it enacted,

1 SECTION 1. The Commonwealth of Virginia shall strengthen hunting regulations by  
2 requiring enhanced hunter education training, stricter licensing  
3 requirements, and limitations on certain hunting methods to promote  
4 wildlife conservation and public safety. These regulations will be  
5 enforced by the Virginia Department of Wildlife Resources.

6 SECTION 2. Hunter Education Certification – A state-approved training program  
7 that teaches firearm safety, wildlife conservation practices, hunting  
8 laws, and ethical hunting standards as administered by the Virginia  
9 Department of Wildlife Resources.

10 Restricted Hunting Methods – Any hunting technique prohibited under  
11 this Act, including but not limited to the use of baiting, electronic  
12 animal calls, or hunting equipment not approved by the  
13 Virginia Department of Wildlife Resources.

14 Wildlife Conservation Zones – Areas designated by the Virginia  
15 Department of Wildlife Resources where additional hunting restrictions  
16 apply in order to protect wildlife populations and ecosystems.

17 Eligible Hunter – An individual who holds a valid Virginia hunting license  
18 and has completed all required hunter education certifications under  
19 this Act.

20 SECTION 3. The Virginia Department of Wildlife Resources will over see and enforce  
21 the enactment of this bill.

22 SECTION 4. This legislation will take effect on September 1, 2026. All laws in conflict  
23 with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

Section 1. Refugees and asylum seekers from Myanmar will become eligible again to receive temporary refugee and protected status.

Section 2.

In June 2025, the Trump administration released an executive order ending temporary protected status for refugees of many countries, including Myanmar

Temporary Protected Status -

a U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) humanitarian program granting temporary legal status, work authorization, and protection from deportation to foreign nationals whose home countries are unsafe due to armed conflict, natural disasters, or other crises. (DHS.gov)

Section 3. The Department of Homeland Security will oversee the enactment and enforcement of this bill.

Section 4. This bill will be enacted April 1st, 2026.

Section 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

Line 01; The federal government shall discourage harmful

Line 01: Article I. This bill will ensure that no federal sales tax be instituted. The sales tax

## Docket A: Virginia Bill 8126

### *A Bill to Ban Hunting*

Be it enacted,

Line 1: Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to organize, promote, or participate in  
Line 2: any contest or organized competition in which participants are offered or are eligible  
Line 3: for prizes or other items of monetary value for the capturing or killing of wild  
Line 4: mammals, birds.

Line 5:

Line 6: Section 2. For the purposes of this bill, a “contest or organized competition” means  
Line 7: any event in which two or more participants compete, where any objective includes  
Line 8: killing, capturing, or accumulating wild animals or birds, whether by number, weight,  
Line 9: size, timeframe, or any other metric, for the purpose of winning prizes. "Prizes"  
Line 10: include, but are not limited to, cash, equipment, trophies, or other items of  
Line 11: monetary value.

Line 12:

Line 13: Section 3. The Virginia Department of Wildlife Resources will oversee this bill.

Line 14: Penalties: Any person who violates Section 1 shall be guilty of a Class 1

Line 15: misdemeanor, punishable by a fine of not less than \$500 and not more than \$2,500  
Line 16: per violation, suspension or revocation of any hunting or trapping license issued by  
Line 17: the Virginia Department of Wildlife Resources, and up to 12 months imprisonment  
Line 18: at the discretion of the court.

Line 19: Exceptions include:

Line 20: (a) Any event where the primary objective is the lawful harvest of white-tailed deer,  
Line 21: bear, or wild turkey.

Line 22: (b) Any project or activity conducted by a state or federal agency for the purpose of  
Line 23: wildlife management or public safety.

Line 24: (c) Fishing tournaments or competitions involving fish, provided that any fish  
Line 25: harvested are done so in compliance with applicable Virginia fishing regulations.

Line 26: (d) Any field trials as defined by the Virginia Department of Wildlife Resources.

Line 27:

Line 28: Section 4. This will go into effect January 1, 2027.
