## **Docket A: International Bill 0321**

### ***THE S.U.P.E.R.S BILL (SUPPLY UNILATERAL PROTECTION AND ECONOMIC REHABILITATIVE SERVICES)***

Be it enacted,

Article I (A): As a result of the passing of this very bill, the United States Congress shall authorize a humanitarian assistance package equalling no less than 200 million dollars and no more than 600 million dollars. The designation of this funding shall be schools, vaccination zones, hospitals, cross-border clinics, and rehabilitation facilities all located in protected zones under the Three Brothers Alliance and The Peoples Defense Force. The goal of this funding is to ensure strategic protection of youth and families by funding medical, rehabilitation, and educational centers. This humanitarian assistance package will be directed through countries including but not limited to Thailand, India, and Malaysia.

Article I (B): In continuation of Article I (B), the United States Congress shall authorize the establishment of a permanent United States protection and monitor office. The goal of this is to ensure the delivery of the aforementioned aid, the protection of future fleeing civilians, and reinforcement of border protection for neighboring countries in the scenario of an attack via Myanmar's (Burma's) junta. This office will assure absolutely no funds are to be directed to the junta and this office shall ensure, in addition, a diplomatic pathway for reestablishing civil rights, stabilizing the economy, and restoring the peace by ending the current administration.

Article II: In the means of this bill: "cross-border clinics" shall be defined as medical facilities that provide medical assistance to patients from a foreign country. "Junta" shall be defined as a military or political group that rules a country after seizing such position by means of force. "Civil rights and peace restoration" shall be defined as the rebuilding of foundational rights outlined by the Geneva Convention for the production of peace. "Economic restabilization pathway" shall be defined as an outlined and planned 'road' by which aid can be administered to failing (ed) economies.

Article III: The Department of State along with The Office of Management and Budget shall be responsible for the coordination and execution of this bill.

Article IV: This bill shall go into effect immediately upon its passage.

Article V: All laws, policies, and treaties in conflict with this bill shall be declared null and void.
