A Bill to Reform The Application of Qualified Immunity in Federal Civil Rights Cases

Be it enacted,

Line 01 SECTION I. PURPOSE AND AUTHORITY

Line 02 Pursuant to Congress’s authority to enforce the Fourteenth Amendment to the
Line 03 United States Constitution, in civil actions brought under 42 U.S.C. §1983 or other
Line 04 federal civil rights statutes, a court shall not grant qualified immunity solely on the
Line 05 grounds that the specific conduct at issue has not previously been ruled unlawful in
Line 06 an identical or substantially similar case.

Line 07 SECTION II. DEFINITIONS

Line 08 For the purposes of this Act, qualified immunity refers to the legal doctrine that
Line 09 shields government officials, including law enforcement officers, from civil liability
Line 10 for actions performed within the scope of their official duties unless the official
Line 11 violated clearly established constitutional or statutory rights.

Line 12 SECTION III. STANDARD FOR JUDICIAL REVIEW

Line 13 In determining whether qualified immunity applies, courts shall evaluate whether a
Line 14 reasonable law enforcement officer in the same circumstances would have
Line 15 understood the conduct to violate constitutional rights, regardless of whether prior
Line 16 court decisions present identical or substantially similar facts.

Line 17 SECTION IV. SCOPE OF APPLICATION

Line 18 The provisions of this Act shall apply to state, local, and federal law enforcement
Line 19 officers acting under color of law.

Line 20 SECTION V. REPORTING AND TRANSPARENCY

Line 21 The United States Department of Justice shall publish an annual report to Congress

Line 11: "Withheld Rent" is defined as the lawful refusal by a tenant to pay rent when a landlord has
failed to remedy a documented habitability violation after receiving written notice.

Line 14: If a court determines that a tenant fabricated a habitability violation, the court may order
payment of owed rent and impose a fine of \$1,000.

A Bill To Support Sanctuary Cities

Be it enacted,

Line 01: SECTION 1. The United States of America shall provide funds to
Line 02: sanctuary cities for the purpose of assisting illegal immigrants
Line 03: through support programs.

Line 05: jurisdictions where cooperation between federal immigration

Docket B: Economic Bill E490

A Bill to Protect Domestic Industry

Be it enacted,

Line 01: Article I: This legislation will aim to protect domestic industry from international outsourcing by introducing countervailing duties on foreign goods, such as automobiles, subsidized by foreign governments. The revenue gained by these duties, in addition to another \$1 billion allocated from the federal discretionary budget, will be used in subsidies towards domestic industry in the same sectors, including in federal investment in rebuilding the American manufacturing base. Enterprises receiving federal funds and subsidies shall be operated by union workforces.

Line 02: Article II: International outsourcing will be defined as the tendency for enterprises to offshore in the search for lower variable capital (labor costs). Countervailing duties will be defined as trade tariffs imposed by importing nations specifically to offset subsidies provided by foreign governments to their exporters, which create unfair competition for domestic industries. They are not blanket tariffs and have a specific purpose.

Line 03: Article III: This legislation shall be enforced by the Department of Commerce, the Department of Customs and Border Protection, and the Department of Labor.

Line 04: Article IV: All laws in conflict with this bill shall hereby be declared null and void.
