## **Docket A: Virginia Bill 1593**

### *A Bill to Raise the State Minimum Wage*

Be it enacted,

Section 1. The state minimum wage shall be increased to \$15.00 per hour for non-tipped workers through annual wage adjustments. The minimum wage for tipped workers shall be increased to \$10.00 per hour, ensuring all employees earn hourly compensation that meets basic living standards.

Section 2. Minimum wage shall be defined as the lowest hourly rate that employers are legally permitted to pay workers. Gradual increases shall be defined as raising the minimum wage by a fixed percentage each year. Tipped workers shall be defined as employees who customarily receive tips as part of their compensation. Their base wage shall be no less than \$10.00 per hour, with employers required to make up any difference if tips do not meet the standard minimum.

Section 3. The Virginia department of labor and industry shall oversee implementation and enforcement of this bill.

Section 4. This bill will go into effect on August 1, 2026.

Section 5. All laws in conflict with this bill are hereby declared null and void.

## **Docket A: Domestic Bill 6788**

*A Bill to protect sanctuary city policies and support immigrant communities.*

Be it enacted,

Section 1. The right of cities and local governments to implement sanctuary policies shall be affirmed. No city, town, or county shall be penalized or lose funding for limiting cooperation with federal immigration enforcement agencies.

Section 2. Sanctuary policy shall be defined as a local government policy that limits cooperation with federal immigration enforcement, including declining to honor detainer requests or arrests based solely on immigration status. Local government shall be defined as any city, town, or county government within a state. Penalized shall be defined as withholding of state or federal funding, fines, or other legal consequences due to implementation of sanctuary policies. Federal immigration enforcement shall be defined as any actions by the U.S. immigration and Customs Enforcement (I.C.E) or other federal agencies to detain, arrest, or deport individuals based on immigration status.

Section 3. The Virginia department of Justice and local city councils shall oversee the implementation and enforcement of this bill.

Section 4. This bill will go into effect on January 1st, 2026.

Section 5. All laws in conflict with this bill are hereby declared null and void.

### *A Resolution to Increase Federal Penalties for Large-Scale Drug Trafficking*

Be it resolved,

(Line:01)

(Line:02) WHEREAS, The United States continues to face a nationwide drug overdose crisis, with over 100,000 overdose deaths annually according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC); and

(Line:03)

(Line:04) WHEREAS, Synthetic opioids such as fentanyl, which the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) reports can be up to 50 times more potent than heroin, are increasingly trafficked into the United States and mixed into other illegal substances, dramatically raising the risk of fatal overdose; and

(Line:05) WHEREAS, Large-scale drug trafficking organizations and cartels generate billions of dollars in profits each year from U.S. drug sales, as documented in the U.S. Department of Justice's National Drug Threat Assessment; and

(Line:06)

(Line:07) WHEREAS, Current federal penalties for high-level trafficking offenses are often treated by criminal organizations as a routine cost of doing business, limiting the deterrent effect of existing law; and

(Line:08)

(Line:09) WHEREAS, Strengthening penalties for large-scale trafficking—while maintaining judicial discretion and focusing on major distributors rather than low-level users—would increase the cost and risk of operating these criminal enterprises, helping to disrupt supply and protect vulnerable communities; now, therefore, be it

(Line:10)

Line:11 RESOLVED, By the Student Congress here assembled, that the United States federal government shall increase criminal penalties for large-scale drug trafficking offenses involving quantities above thresholds established by the Controlled Substances Act; and be it further

(Line:13) RESOLVED, That these enhanced penalties shall prioritize high-level traffickers and organizers within criminal networks, and shall not increase mandatory minimums for simple possession or low-level, non-violent drug offenses; and be it further

(Line:15) RESOLVED, That a portion of any additional funds collected through asset forfeiture in large-scale trafficking cases shall be directed to evidence-based substance use treatment and prevention programs.

Be it resolved,

Line 1: WHEREAS, Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD) is an incurable, 100% fatal neurological  
Line 2: disease that has been confirmed in over 17 Virginia counties and is actively  
Line 3: spreading, posing a significant threat to the long-term health of the state's deer  
Line 4: population; and

Line 5: WHEREAS, the disease is caused by infectious prions that can persist in the  
Line 6: environment for years, making proactive, widespread surveillance necessary to  
Line 7: detect, contain, and limit the spread of the disease to new, unaffected areas of the  
Line 8: Commonwealth; and

Line 9: WHEREAS, failure to adequately monitor CWD prevalence allows infected deer to  
Line 10: spread the disease further, potentially leading to a 10% or greater annual population  
Line 11: decline in affected areas, harming local ecology, reducing recreational hunting  
Line 12: opportunities, and decreasing the economic contribution of deer hunting to rural  
Line 13: economies; and

Line 14: WHEREAS, current voluntary testing rates are insufficient to provide the necessary  
Line 15: data to accurately map the disease's spread, necessitating mandatory testing to  
Line 16: ensure robust surveillance, particularly in Disease Management Areas; now,  
Line 17: therefore, be it

Line 18: RESOLVED, That the Student Congress here assembled recommends that the  
Line 19: Virginia Department of Wildlife Resources implement mandatory CWD testing for all  
Line 20: deer harvested

### *A Bill to Establish Paid Paternal Leave to Promote Family Stability and Workplace Equity*

Be it enacted,

LINE 001: SECTION 1. All eligible fathers in the United States shall be  
LINE 002: entitled to six (6) weeks of paid paternal leave following the birth,  
LINE 003: adoption, or foster placement of a child. All eligible employees  
LINE 004: shall receive seventy percent (70%) of their weekly average wages  
LINE 005: during the duration of their leave.

LINE 006: SECTION 2. a) Father” refers to a biological father, adoptive  
LINE 007: father, or the legally recognized guardian of a child (in cases of  
LINE 008: foster care).

LINE 009: “eligible employees” refers to employees who have worked at  
LINE 010: a minimum of six (6) consecutive months at a/the given company,  
LINE 011: given that the employer has twenty (20) or more employees;  
LINE 012: (twenty (20) or more employees requires more federal obligations  
LINE 013: for a business: health insurance benefits, discrimination protection  
LINE 014: , etc.) “weekly average wages” is calculated based on the average  
LINE 015: weekly take-home salary during the past six (6) months period.

LINE 016: SECTION 3. The United States Department of Labor Family  
LINE 017: and Medical Leave (FMLA), currently under the jurisdiction  
LINE 018: of the “Women’s Bureau,” if enacted, this bill will expand family  
LINE 019: leave to both parents.

LINE 020: SECTION 4. This legislation will take effect on July 1, 2027.

LINE 021: All laws in conflict with this legislation are declared null and void.

### *A Bill to Expand Refugee Resettlement for Displaced People in Myanmar*

Be it enacted,

LINE 001: SECTION 1. The United States shall expand refugee resettlement  
LINE 002: opportunities for individuals displaced by violence and political  
LINE 003: instability in Myanmar by allocating additional refugee admissions  
LINE 004: slots and humanitarian assistance specifically for displaced persons  
LINE 005: from Myanmar and surrounding refugee-hosting nations.  
LINE 006: SECTION 2. (a) “Displaced persons from Myanmar” refers  
LINE 007: to individuals who have fled or been forcibly removed from their  
LINE 008: homes in Myanmar due to persecution, armed conflict, or human  
LINE 009: rights violations following the military coup.

## **Super Session: Virginia Bill 2987**

### *A Bill to Expand Renewable Energy Requirements*

Be it enacted,

Section 1. All electric utilities within the state increase the percentage of electricity generated from renewable energy sources in order to promote cleaner energy production and improve long-term grid reliability.

Section 2. Electric utility shall be defined as any public or private company that generates, transmits, or distributes electricity to consumers within the state of Virginia. Renewable energy shall be defined as electricity produced from naturally replenishing sources, including but not limited to solar, wind, geothermal, hydroelectric, and certified biomass. Renewable energy requirement is defined as the mandated percentage of electricity that must come from renewable sources. Renewable energy credit shall be defined as a certificate verifying that one megawatt hour of electricity was generated from a renewable source.

Section 3. The Virginia state energy commission shall oversee implementation and enforcement of this bill.

Section 4. This bill will go into effect on January 1, 2027.

Section 5. All laws in conflict with this bill are hereby declared null and void.
